- 1. Extremely few of those folk (professional or volunteer) who presume to teach "what 'we' believe" have ever reexamined "what 'we' believe" <u>objectively</u>.
- 2. When "what 'we' believe" is presented as a forgone conclusion, the typical believer is afraid to question it...except in their often perplexed minds. *Cognitive Dissonance* reigns in the hearts and minds of many of the otherwise intelligent folk who fear the "Doubting Thomas" label with a major passion.
- 3. The masses, including churchgoers, are <u>headline</u> readers. They rarely grasp what follows a headline, except when it comes to things that entertain them. For example, those who regularly hear the Calvinist

headline, We're not under Law; we're under Grace! are apt NOT to comprehend, What then? shall we sin, because we are not under the law...? at Romans 6:15

- 4. Churchgoers <u>love</u> their preachers and teachers. It is perhaps subconscious for most, but there is the pervasive presumption that preachers and teachers are "called" and "chosen" and we are not, so they are our superiors.
- 5. Real folk are attracted to free stuff, as in the current political arena. Passive church folk have invested their Faith Equity_{sm} in their preachers and teachers. In doing that, they effectively confirm the presumption of christian elitism for those folk, who come to treasure it. A typically effective way for them to perpetuate their elite status is to sugar-coat the Salvation message for their admirers: Those free tickets to Heaven are selling like hotcakes!

If our lovely young Sunday School teacher gal is to die in her unrepented lifestyle of one-night-stands, there will be no participation trophy for her. If our handsome young traveling business guy is to die in his unrepented lifestyle of alternating between one-night-stands and "getting saved" again, there will

be no participation trophy for him on Judgment Day, either. Both mindsets and both of those lifestyles are a mockery of Our Lord's sacrifice at Calvary.

"I know we're not supposed to be *Doubting Tomases*, Linda, but I just can't help it! Every time I find myself questioning things I hear or see in church or on Christian TV, I have to pray for forgiveness!"

"I used to do that, too, Liz. But then I read something that told me that skepticism can be a GOOD thing – not a bad thing at all!" offered Linda. "Look! It's right here in your Bible!"

Now the Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.
